It has been another successful week at Chellaston Academy and we are delighted to provide a synopsis of this in our weekly communication.

Changes to School Day

MFL Speaking Exams April/May 2023

All students were on time and conducted themselves in an exemplary manner. It was clearly evident that students had spent time revising and preparing for these exams.

Key Stage 5 News

We are incredibly proud of the way they have approached the last two years of study, as a year group they are friendly, caring, and extremely hardworking. They have all become wonderful young adults. The next few weeks are very busy for year 12 with upcoming mock exams, the trip to the UCAS Fayre in Birmingham as well as continuing their next steps research. We are delighted to invite Parents and Carers of our Year 12 students in for a Next Steps Information evening on Thursday 13th July at 18:00 in the Main Hall. During this short meeting we will discuss the different pathways that our Year 12 students may wish to take after Sixth Form, look at the processes involved with each pathway, and explain the support that is on offer as well as highlighting the key deadlines.

Connect

Last week our onsite alternative provision - Connect, had it's second Trust quality assurance visit since September when it first opened and we are pleased to say that it continues to go from strength to strength in providing a safe place for some of our

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vulnerable young people who for a variety of reasons are finding main school education difficult and disengaging. During their Healthy eating lesson the Connect students worked really hard to prepare and make their own pasta dishes with Mr Howard. Next week they are going to be making their own healthy burgers from scratch. Take a look of some of their hard work.



Assemblies this week

Mrs Grimwood delivered assemblies this week on Stress, what it looks like, why some stress is good for us and tips for reducing stress both in school and the wider world. Students interacted and were well engaged and hopefully took on some of the strategies suggested for coping with stress. This leads well into the National

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Mental Health Awareness week next week which will be the focus of whole school assemblies.



During the assemblies, students were introduced to the stress bucket model, which works on the basis that we all have a stress bucket - the size of which differs according to our levels of resilience. If our stress bucket overflows we potentially enter fight, flight or freeze mode. Stress can cause our brain to flood with a chemical called dopamine so we struggle to think clearly and make good decisions. What healthy people have on their stress bucket therefore is a 'tap' - which is a relaxing and endorphin producing activity that they incorporate on a regular basis and that allows stress to drain out of the bucket, meaning that it never gets to the point of overflow. The idea of creating an effective 'tap' on the stress bucket therefore involves identifying and participating in activities that provide both distraction, self-expression and endorphin production.

Knife crime awareness

Next week is National #KnifeCrimeAwarenessWeek, which highlights the complexity of the problem, the devastation that it causes to families and communities and ultimately that knife crime is preventable. All 43 forces across the country take part in an attempt to crack down on knife and weapon-related crime and violence.

Throughout the week our local PCSOs and Safer Neighbourhood Team will be doing several intensified areas of work where they will be proactively looking at focusing on education, engagement, prevention, and enforcement. They will hold a pop-up stall in school during break and lunch on Thursday and will create a virtual



presentation on knife crime and safety for certain year groups. We will be doing follow up activities during form to explore the impact of knife crime and how to access support.


Chocolate Bingo
