Although the temperatures across the region have been unusually warm, we are delighted to report that the learning climate within the school has remained of a high standard.

Our values of Integrity, Care and Excellence are visible in abundance, and it is a genuine pleasure to be an around the academy.

Uniform week commencing 19th June 2023

The predicted temperatures next week are due to drop, therefore there will be changes to our uniform expectations next week. From next week, blazers will not expected to be worn, but all other uniform items, including ties, will be expected to be worn.

Teaching & Learning

We'd just like to take this opportunity to thank all of our incredible students and staff this week in regards to the number of positive "on calls". This initiative allows any teacher to request a member of SLT to visit their lesson and look at the great work produced by students in the lesson. This can take the form of singling out any individual student or recognise the whole class as a team. 1391 positive behaviour points have been handed out just this week - this really captures our culture of Integrity, Care & Excellence.

YEAR 11 Exams

Today, (Friday June 16th) was the final full cohort examination for our Year 11 GCSE students. Students sat their sixth(!) science examination. Throughout the past four examination weeks, the students have been amazing with very few phone calls for absent or late students. Getting 280 people in and out of a large venue in total silence for a lengthy amount of time can be quite difficult, but our students have really stepped up and realised the importance of the situation. Exams are running like clockwork due to the hard work put in by our teaching staff and our exam team. There are still a handful of smaller exams taking place next week. Even though the Y11 students no longer have lessons, they need to turn up to any remaining exams in uniform.

Year 10 Mock Examinations

One of the main reasons for the success of the Year 11 examinations is that they have sat examinations in totally formal settings (Invigilators, exam timetables, full protocols followed) on four separate occasions. After a pretty poor start in Summer 2022, Year 11 began to understand the routines and regulations until they totally mastered it in the real thing. We are now starting this successful process with Year 10 as the Sports Hall venue starts to get some vacant mornings and afternoons. On Thursday, Year 10 had an assembly about exam protocols led by Mrs Holdgate and Ms Scattergood, who is our exams officer. Some Year 10s have already done their Art examination or a French/Spanish speaking examination. All students have been given a personalised printout of their examinations which will continue right through until the 30th June. Examinations will be conducted under identical conditions to the real thing, with our full team of experienced invigilators being used throughout the next fortnight. We put this level of effort and detail in at this early stage to reduce anxiety when students are faced with the real thing.

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Timetable Room Changes

Next week sees the start of our refurbishment getting underway. With the departure of Year 11 and Year 13, the capacity of the school gets increased with free rooms appearing more often. However, this year we are removing a few classrooms out of circulation as they get refurbished. Some rooms are being used as storage for heavy equipment whilst the renovations take place. From Monday, rooms in Health and Social Care, Art, Technology, English and Science are being closed. This means a considerable amount of re-rooming. Students will be given a reprint of their timetables, so that they are aware of any changes.

Vaping

The significant dangers of vaping are becoming more evident as more research is completed. The government has also recently pledged to impose stricter sanctions on the distribution of vapes. As a city we are very concerned for our young people and as a result all of the Derby Headteachers have gathered a joint response to vaping, this starts with an awareness week. To support the awareness week, we have attached a link to the joint letter and a PowerPoint which provides a few more facts. As an academy we will also be following up with our own education so please look out for further information.

Year 13 News

As the A Level exam season draws to a close, we want to say a huge well done to our fantastic Year 13 students who really have been a credit to the academy and in particular to the Sixth Form in the last 2 years. We recognise that this has been a challenging two years for our students, parents, and carers. We would like to say how proud we are of the effort, resilience, and maturity shown by the year group and we would also like to take the opportunity to thank parents and carers for their support. It has been a pleasure to work with Year 13 and we wish them every success in their future. We look forward to celebrating with them at their Prom on Thursday 29th June and then again on results day, Thursday 17th August. Full details regarding collection of A Level results, student next steps and all the support on offer have been sent directly to Year 13 students and parents.

Year 12 News

The year 12 mock exams have taken place this week. The students have shown excellence through their phenomenal attendance record and exemplary conduct throughout the exam period. Results will be released in July, however feedback on strengths and areas for development will take place within lessons earlier than this. All students should return from study leave, on Monday.

This week, we opened our student leader application process, and we look forward to welcoming in our new student leadership team, after what will be a rigorous and rewarding process.
