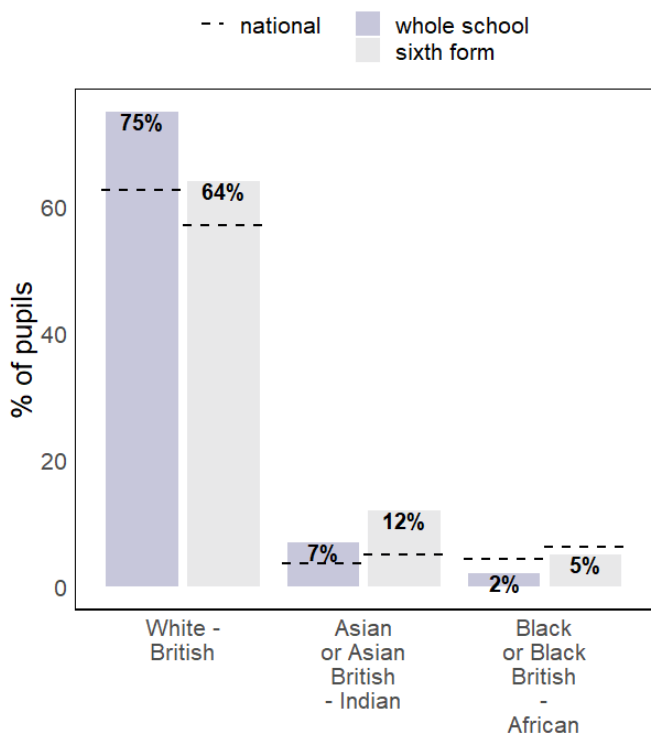

- *For the whole school, there is nothing significant or exceptional to highlight for total suspensions compared to either all schools or schools with a similar level of deprivation in 2021/22, therefore no conclusions can be drawn from this data.*
- *For the whole school, there is nothing significant or exceptional to highlight for repeat suspensions compared to all schools in 2021/22, therefore no conclusions can be drawn from this data. For the whole*

school, the rate of repeat suspensions (2.2%) was in the **highest** 20% of schools with a similar level of deprivation in 2021/22.

- Of the 69 pupils in the whole school with at least one suspension in 2021/22, 55% were suspended on more than one occasion and 11.6% received 10 or more suspensions during the year.
- Of the 261 total suspensions in the whole school in 2021/22, the following reasons each accounted for more than 10%: **persistent disruptive behaviour** (105), verbal abuse/threatening behaviour against an adult (66).
- There were no permanent exclusions in the whole school in 2021/22. The national average for this year was 2. There were no permanent exclusions in the previous year either.

16 to 18

- There were 3 students at 16 to 18 suspended at least once in 2021/22. The national average for this year was 1. There were none in 2020/21.
 - Of the 4 total suspensions at 16 to 18 in 2021/22, the following reasons each accounted for more than 10%: **sexual misconduct** (1), **drug or alcohol related** (1), **abuse against sexual orientation and gender identity** (1), **inappropriate use of social media or online technology** (1).
 - There were no permanent exclusions at 16 to 18 in 2021/22. The national average for this year was close to zero. There were no permanent exclusions in the previous year either.
