This session aligns with our commitment to the Provider Access Legislation (PAL), an evolution of the Baker Clause and a mandatory requirement for state schools in England. PAL mandates that schools facilitate access for college and training providers, enabling them to guide students on alternative academic routes like T Levels and apprenticeships. Our aim is to broaden horizons and empower students to make informed choices about their educational and career pathways.

We would like to inform you that we have few cases of chicken pox that have been reported to school. If you have any concerns please contact a medical professional.


#### Measles


#### Valentine's Bake Sale - Year 11
