Year 8 Parents' Evening

Year 7 Parents' Evening & early closure Thursday June 13th

This sounds quite a long way away, but it's only the second week back! Bookings for this will open on Thursday June 6th at 6pm. Unlike the Y8 Parents' Evening, this will be face-to-face. School will close at 13:20 and the school will revert back to period 4 being at 12:20 so that only one lesson is lost. More details about the evening will be sent to Y7 parents.

Year 10 Mock Examinations (Monday 17th June – Friday 28th June)

As we go into half term, we are halfway through the Y11 GCSE exams, with seven out of the fourteen core examinations completed. Although there are a few GCSE exams after Friday June 14th, a large number of Year 11 will have completed their exams. As soon as their exams start to peter out, we use the same facilities and staffing to start the Year 10 Mock Examinations.

These are done as closely to the real thing as possible. We set up these venues three times before the real thing, to help reduce anxiety with students undertaking exams. All students will receive an individual exam timetable on the first day back.

Students who are doing Art and Photography will also do a five-hour practical day off-timetable. (The photography couldn't be fitted into the main two week block).

Year 10 Sexual Health Workshop


