Our students have access to so many amazing opportunities. One of the most important keys to opening up the best opportunities in life for all our students is securing their GCSE grades in Maths and English. Last year, 91% of Chellaston students who missed less than 9 days of school achieved a grade 4 or higher in Maths and English. This dropped to just 54.5% of students who missed more than 19 days. Attendance is not the only factor (!), but we do know the more our students are with us, the more support we can give them to achieve the best for them!

Prefects & Wellbeing Ambassadors

On Tuesday morning this week we had around 25 prefects and wellbeing ambassadors complete some training with Miss Jones and Mrs Skinner. They are developing these student leadership roles within the academy and the year 12 and 13's did some scenario training and exciting planning for Charity events in the future.
