It was heartwarming to see the students' reactions upon reconnecting with their former teachers.

Waterstones Trip

Mrs Lloyla took a group of students to Waterstones to use their book tokens received from the library art competition last academic year. We asked our students to help design some artwork that would reflect our new library space and to represent what reading what meant to them. We framed the work and displayed the winning pieces in the foyer of the new library. Waterstones had staff on hand to guide our students to the most appropriate book choices for them and to get them even more excited about the wonders and joy of reading!



Geography Field Trips

The last two weeks of half term have been a busy time for A level and GCSE Geography students who have completed their final fieldwork days in preparation for the examinations next summer.

On Monday and Tuesday 100 year 11 GCSE Geography students visited Birmingham to complete their fieldwork investigating how the quality of the environment differs between inner city areas and the city centre. The students worked fantastically well and displayed our values of Integrity, Care and Excellence throughout the day. Students worked hard to collect primary data in and around Highgate, China Town and the Bullring shopping area, for use in their fieldwork examination in the summer.

Last week year 13 Geography students visited Nottingham to investigate the ongoing regeneration of the city. Students first investigated the improved public transport infrastructure around the train station, tram station and new bus station along with new cycle infrastructure and e-bike rental scheme. Next students visited the site of the former Broadmarsh shopping centre that is being transformed into the Green Heart City Park containing trees, rain garden areas, wilding and the new library. Students also investigated how Nottingham was marking Black History Month by assessing the impact of historic migration of workers from the Caribbean recruited to work in the lace industry. Finally, students went on to visit Sneinton to look at the rapid transformation of the area as a result of studentification, a form of gentrification.

Alternative Provision (AP) overview

We have a number of students who access external alternative provision placements and are working towards vocational qualifications on their afternoon or day out each week. Every half term staff visit to check in and see how they are getting on and see them in action outside of the usual school setting. All provisions we use have said how delightful our students are and said what a credit they are to us and we wanted to celebrate and showcase the positive effects Alternative Provisions are having on some of our students -

KD (Construction) was so happy and settled - it was lovely to see. He is currently making a wooden planter and painting it grey (it looks amazing) and so professional. They are currently doing a bricklaying assessment, and again, what they have learnt is beyond belief at their age and the skills they are gaining from this provision is second to none.

OS (Baby People) First time ever I have visited and when I walked in the atmosphere was electric from the staff and the students. Both of our students there were beaming when they saw us and invited us into the studio to listen to what they had been recording, all I can say is WOW!

FH is doing really well, digging out steps to the river and then making the steps out of wood. The Teacher said he was a great example leading the others and showing them what to do, the Teacher also said that he is the ideal candidate for the apprenticeship scheme they have in Nottingham at the moment!

GR is doing great and they are really happy with him. He gets his head down and doesn't let others distract him. He loved showing me all the work he has completed which included, two coffee tables, a work bench, a planter and a bird table. The staff there think very highly of him and he is doing great in his assessments.

IM was really engaged and working hard on her theory work when I visited. Eager to show me her portfolio of work. All her most recent carpentry work had been taken home earlier in the week including a bench and planter.

JS was very happy to see us and was smiling away. He is enjoying the provision and invited us into the studio and said he has been writing music and rapping, nothing recorded yet so will listen next time. He said he feels safe, happy and is really enjoying his time there making music and working towards the Music Practitioner's Award qualification. The staff said he is very talented.
