Dear Pupils, Staff and Parents at Chellaston Academy,

Thank you for your Harvest donations

On behalf of everyone at Padley and YMCA Derbyshire, I would like to express our deepest gratitude for your generous Harvest Festival donation. Your contribution has a direct impact on our ability to continue offering essential support and services to individuals and families at risk of homelessness, poverty, and social exclusion.

Your donation during the Harvest Festival is vital to our work, as it helps us to sustain our services and provide a safety net for those most in need. Without your generosity, many of the people we support would not have access to the food, shelter, and services that allow them to take their first steps towards a brighter future.

We'd like to tell you about one of the people we've recently been able to support as a result of donations we receive. Jayne reached out to us when she moved to Derby to seek refuge from the trauma of domestic violence. We supported her to find safe and secure accommodation, and from

our own warehouse we provided Jayne with essential household items, along with food and toiletries to help her settle in her new home. Jayne recently got back in touch with us to express how grateful she was for our warm friendly approach, knowing that there were people who cared, made all the difference to her starting a new life.

It's been another busy year for our Padley@YMCA Derbyshire team. As a result of the support we have received we have supported many individuals and families to access:

- **Emergency Food, Clothing, and Toiletries**: Providing immediate relief to individuals facing hardship and ensuring their basic needs are met.
- **Community Hub Meals**: Offering nutritious breakfasts and lunches, to those in need. Last year, we provided over 24,000 meals to many who would have otherwise gone hungry.
- **Cooking and Budgeting Courses**: Hands-on sessions teach people how to prepare healthy meals on a budget and equipping them with valuable life skills that promote self-sufficiency.
- **Mental Health and Wellbeing Support**: We understand the importance of mental health, and we provide one-on-one support, group sessions, and activities that help people manage stress, anxiety, and other challenges.
- Access to Critical Services: Our community hub connects individuals with essential services, including substance misuse recovery programs, employability workshops, debt and welfare advice, and healthcare services.
- **Housing and Homelessness Support**: We offer safe, secure accommodation for people in crisis, providing a foundation from which they can rebuild their lives. Our residents also benefit from tailored support that helps them develop the skills needed to move towards independence.

We also work with other local organisations, such as "Food 4 Thought Alliance" and "Safe and Sound Group," to redistribute surplus food, ensuring that even more individuals and families across Derby receive the help they need.

Since merging with YMCA Derbyshire, Padley has become an even stronger force for positive change in the community. When our new Community Hub opens on Parcel Terrace, we are expanding our services to include a community kitchen and pantry, where families and individuals in emergency accommodation can prepare their own meals. This initiative ensures that those without access to kitchen facilities have the dignity and autonomy to cook for themselves and their families.

Cycling to and from school - Be Safe!

We would like to remind parents of all students who cycle to and from school that it is a legal requirement to have working lights attached to the bike when cycling before and after sunrise.

The most basic requirement of the law is to **fit a white front light and a red rear light, which must be clean and working properly, when cycling between sunset and sunrise**. Reflectors should also be fitted to pedals and the rear of the cycle. Lights are not needed when the cycle is stationary or being pushed along the roadside.


