# **Communication at Chellaston Academy**

# **Drop off & Pick up at Chellaston Academy**

We'd like to kindly remind parents/ carers that due to health and safety reasons, students cannot be dropped off on site by car at the beginning **or** end of the school day. The only exception to this would be if you have special permit given by Mrs Holdgate.



Planetary alignment sees 6 planets visible in the night sky, into the beginning of February You'll likely have heard news that a 'planetary alignment' is visible in January 2025 and into February, but are wondering what planets are actually visible, and how special this 'alignment' is. January and February 2025 are good months for observing the planets (except for Mercury), as Venus, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune are all visible in the night sky.

Head out around 7pm in January 2025 and you'll be able to see the planetary alignment of Mars, Jupiter, Venus and Saturn, as well as Uranus and Neptune, visible in the sky. At this time, Mars will be in the east, Jupiter in the southeast, Venus and Saturn close together in the southwest. Jupiter is visible above the constellation Orion, so it's easy to spot. Venus looks like a remarkably bright star in the twilight sky and is quite beautiful to see.

You can download a free app to your phone called 'stellarium'. When you open it, you see a star map of the sky in the direction you hold up your phone so you can move it about and see the names of stars and constellations in front of you and use it to identify the planets that are visible to eye currently on a clear night.

The purpose of this intervention is to not only build confidence in our younger students when reading a text but it also helps them to build connections with the older students while developing an enjoyment of reading. It is one of our most magical intervention times as the leaders help to steer and guide their buddies in a private space where they feel safe to practice reading without judgement. The library space becomes a hive of hushed activity and is used exactly as it should be!



# **Derby City Youth Mayor Elections**

Today, many of our students took part in experiencing the important British Value of Democracy. The Derby City Youth Mayor elections took place today at Chellaston. Pupils have watched the four candidates on video this week in form time and took to the polling station today. # **Year 11 DREF Study Space**

From Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> February, our Year 11s have access to use the DREF as a private study space.

We have run this provision for the last few years and students find it beneficial for a number of reasons:

- The space is open from 3.15pm to 5pm every night after school so students can continue in the mindset of being in a space to study
- We ask for silent work so that the space provides an opportunity away from the hustle and bustle to be able to concentrate
- We provide laptops should the students need to continue with coursework, research or homework
- There is a member of staff on duty every night so that students can be supported.

We ask that students come prepared with work to do as it will not be provided for them - it is not a revision session in the form of a structured subject being lead by a member of staff; it is for the students to continue building their independence so that they are as ready as they can be for the GCSEs and for their next steps. Please encourage your child to attend.



## **Year 11 Mock Interviews**

The Year 11 Mock Interviews held yesterday provided students with a valuable opportunity to practice their interview skills in a realistic setting. Organised with the support of volunteers from the business community, the event aimed to prepare students for future college, job or apprenticeship interviews.

Each student participated in a one-on-one interview, receiving personalised feedback on their interview. The volunteers, representing a range of industries and professions, shared their expertise and insights, enhancing the relevance of the experience.

The event was highly beneficial in building students' confidence, sharpening their interpersonal skills, and offering a glimpse into real-world expectations, contributing to their readiness for their next steps.







## **Guinness World Record - Poetry Lesson**

Back in October, 7BTT had the opportunity to take part in a very special poetry lesson. They formed part of a Guinness World Record attempt for taking part in the world's largest poetry lesson. Led by the poet Laura Mucha, the students helped to compose a poem about counting.
