## **Introducing Sully: Our New School Dog**

Starting in September 2025, we're excited to welcome Sully, a 4-year-old Labrador, as our new school dog. Sully isn't new to this role; he has experience working in school environments, making him a perfect fit to support our students.

## What Sully Brings to Our School Community

Research has shown that the presence of a school dog can have numerous benefits for students, including:

- Interacting with dogs can lower cortisol levels, helping students feel more relaxed during stressful times.
- Sully's presence can encourage positive interactions among students, fostering a sense of community and belonging.
- Spending time with Sully can boost mood and self-esteem, providing comfort and support to students.
- Caring for Sully can teach students important life skills such as empathy, responsibility, and respect for others.

#### What to Expect

Assemblies introducing Sully (through pictures) have already taken place. In the coming weeks, we'll be sending letters to parents/carers to gather important information, such as any allergies or fears students might have regarding dogs. Once all information is collated, we'll work with parents and carers to produce risk assessments tailored to specific individuals and the wider school.

#### **ICE Festival 2025**


The ICE team are very excited for the ICE Festival on Tuesday 22nd July this year. Plans are well underway for those students with a 95% positive ratio.


In preparation for the exams, now is the time for students to check that they have the correct stationery, a clear pencil case, a calculator and their ID card.

## **Mental Health Awareness Week**


